Jeff Siirola retired in 2011 as a Technology Fellow at Eastman Chemical Company where he had been for more than 39 years. He now holds half time positions as Professor of Engineering Practice at Purdue University and Distinguished Service Professor of Sustainable Energy Systems at Carnegie Mellon University. He received a BS in chemical engineering from the University of Utah and a PhD in chemical engineering from the University of Wisconsin-Madison for early work in the area of computer-aided chemical process invention and the basis for the textbook "Process Synthesis" written with Dale F. Rudd and Gary J. Powers.
